## Managing Frost Delays

Turf can be severely damaged by foot traffic or cart traffic when there is frost on the grass, with the greens being particularly susceptible to damage. If you reserve a morning tee time and the forecast overnight low temperature is below 40 degrees, you may want to consider calling the Pro Shop when it opens in the morning to determine if there will be a frost delay and, if so, how long it is expected to be. Depending on the specific conditions on any given day, a frost delay could last as little as fifteen minutes or as long as several hours. While we enjoy your company around the clubhouse during frost delays, you may have more important priorities that you want to address while we are waiting for the frost to clear and the course to open.
